Clé's Zellige tiles are likewise made by hand-and hand-painted, with a variable mineral glaze—so have the characteristic undulating, imperfect surfaces and slight variations in shading. These Moroccan-made beauties, offered in 21 colors from weathered white to palace red, come as 2- and 4-inch squares, 2-by-6-inch rectangles, and 3-inch hexagons.
